General Program Information

Teacher Academy students are required to maintain AT LEAST a college preparatory course of study throughout their junior and senior years. Community service hours will be collected at the end of each grading period and applied to the quarter grade. Teacher Academy students are also expected to maintain EXCELLENT attendance including absences, tardies and early dismissals. In order to continue to the senior program, students must successfully complete the junior program. Failure to meet any or all of these requirements will result in the student NOT being permitted to continue to the senior program.
