Descriptive essays about a place

Descriptive writing about a place should transport the reader to the location you are writing about. You do not just tell the readers where that place is or what's there—your words should make the readers **feel** as if they are really in, or really want to visit, that place you are talking about.

As much as possible, you should guide your readers to the place you are talking about through the effective and creative use of words. Using strong verbs and interesting nouns helps a lot in writing a descriptive paragraph about a place. Try to avoid using too many adjectives or adverbs. Do **not** use abstract words: cool, tight, awesome, etc.

The Badlands of Montana

Mauvaises terres. The first missionary explorers had given this place its name, a translation of the Plains Indian term meaning something like hard-to-travel country, for its daunting walls and pinnacles and buttresses of eroded sandstone and sheer clay. A horseback rider wouldn't have too much difficulty getting past the blisters and eruptions that scarred the prairie here. The late Bronze Age fort is a set of stone walls covering about 14 acres that are protected by an outer defense of jagged stones protecting various passages and chambers.

The scent of white chocolate, dark chocolate and every shade in between will envelope you as you tour the Cadbury chocolate factory in new Zealand.
