2016 has been a record setting year for calls for EWFD. We ran a total of 651 calls compared to 549 call in 2015. With the safer grant and the staffing it provided, we were able to handle these calls with quicker response times than in the past. These calls included fires, rescues, motor vehicle accidents, medical emergencies, public service calls, and mutual aid requests.

Grants



Additionally, we were awarded a Retention and Recruitment Grant, which provided funds to retain and recruit volunteers. 
Public Education/Safety


