

NUR 325 Comprehensive Health Assessment Demonstration Video Guidelines

For Final Project Part I, you will submit a video of the comprehensive health assessment. The guidelines below must be followed for video submissions.

Related to the Patient and to Ensure Privacy

- Do not use the complete name of your patient in the video.
- Your patient should wear loose clothing (e.g., shorts and a t-shirt). Consider who your patient is.
- If they are not comfortable in shorts, pants are acceptable. Clothing should be loose, not restrictive, and allow for range of motion testing. Do not have your patient wear a gown.
- You will perform the exam over the patient's clothing (realizing that in a real clinical situation, you would not perform the exam over clothing).
- During the video demonstration, you may clarify points of the performance by stating what you are doing or what you would be doing if the patient were wearing a gown (for example, observing the thorax for heaves, impulses, and skin integrity, but not lifting the shirt to do so).

Preparing for Recording

- You may not look at your notes or the comprehensive health assessment.
- If you need to refer to your notes or comprehensive health assessment checklist, please consider further practicing of the skills demonstration of this comprehensive health assessment prior to final submission of a video for grading. Therefore, if you are recording and you stop the recording, the instructor will assume that you looked at the comprehensive health assessment checklist before starting the next section. If you are observed looking at notes or the checklist during the recording, you will not meet the criteria; in that case, you will have to practice the exam until you can perform it smoothly.
- Note that placing notes or the comprehensive health assessment checklist out of the camera view but within your vision is cheating, and cheating is not acceptable.
