SUBJECT – ENGLISH 2

LESSON 6 – PRONOUN

The students will watch the video given in the website to understand the concept of Pronoun and its types.

- **Pronoun** – Pronouns are words which are used in place of a noun. It is used to avoid repetition of the noun over and over again. Let us consider the following example-

Seema did not go to school. **Seema** is ill.

In the above sentence instead of repeating the noun Seema over and over again, we can write it as-

Seema did not go to school. **She** is ill.

The word **she** is a pronoun.

- **Types of pronoun** – Pronouns are of the following types-

-  **Personal pronoun** – It refers to some specific person, place or thing. Personal pronouns are of three types.

- > Personal pronouns of the first person – It refers to the person speaking. The pronouns **I, me, mine, we, us,** and **our** are first person pronouns.
- > Personal pronouns of the second person – It refers to the person spoken to. The pronouns **you** and **yours** are second person pronouns.
- > Personal pronouns of third person – It refers to the person or thing spoken about. The pronouns **he, him, she, her, it, they, their,** and **them** are third person pronouns.

-  **Demonstrative pronoun** – It is used to point out person or things. **This, that, these** and **those** are demonstrative pronouns. **This** and **that** are singular demonstrative pronoun and **these** and **those** are plural demonstrative pronoun.

-  **Interrogative pronoun** – It is used for asking questions. The pronouns **what, who, which, whom** and **whose** are interrogative pronouns.

-  **Reflexive pronoun** – It is used when the subject and the object of the action is the same person, animal or thing. The pronouns **himself, herself, itself, myself, yourself, ourselves** and **themselves** are reflexive pronoun.
