

Writing a conclusion script

Here we will look at how to write your conclusion.

The first point you must adhere to is to ensure you do not introduce new material, or content that you have not discussed within your project. A conclusion is not the place for new information. It is your final opportunity to engage your reader, to leave an impact, an imprint, an impression upon them. A thorough and engaging conclusion will make your work more impactful.

So, begin with a topic related sentence to maintain context and focus. Then go back to your introduction, what were you aiming to cover, and make sure you are still in focus and relevant. Summarise the main points of your work, the main ideas and findings, the key points you feel are pertinent to this topic. Appeal to the emotions of the reader, try to embrace the ideas and share your passion, sense of importance, the real key issues you feel are essential in your work. Then close the work. Try to be succinct. Give a sense of how significant your point or points are in relation to the broader context of the topic area. End clearly and not abruptly. Make sure it reads as though you have finished and not simply run out of words!

A good conclusion takes time. Plan in time to write this.

Remember to make time your friend and not your opponent!
