



ASA Programme

You are working for an organisation, a company, a municipality, a university or an association and pursue social, ecological and economical sustainability goals? You would like to offer young persons who are dedicated to fair and sustainable development a project internship including concrete tasks? From May to July, August or September – depending on the field of activity and the programme format – you can propose a project internship for the ASA Programme 2019.

What is the ASA Programme?

The ASA Programme is a learning and capacity-building programme dedicated to development education based in Germany. It is aimed at young people who want to understand global interdependencies, who ask critical questions and who want to strengthen a fair world. Mutual learning and responsible social action for sustainable development and fair global interaction are at the heart of the programme.

The ASA Programme is part of Engagement Global and is mostly financed by the German Ministry of Development and Economic Cooperation (BMZ).

Course of the programme

During seminars lasting several days the participants gain competences dealing with diversity and conflicts as well as methods of group and project work. Participants exchange about their own position within global power structures and reflect on privileges and racism. During the three-or six-months project internships in African, Asian, Latin American or South-Eastern European countries – and in Germany – the participants contribute to your project objectives and get to know new perspectives on your field of work. They reflect on their experiences and develop ways to integrate them in their everyday life and in future engagement.

ASA programme calendar

May to July, August or September, 2018: Deadline for submission of project proposals (please consider concrete dates)

Mid of October, 2018: Project selection by the ASA Programme

November 20, 2018, to January 10, 2019: Publication of the selected ASA projects online. Interested young professionals and students can apply.

January and February, 2019: Selection of participants

March to June, 2019: Participants attend at least two seminars in Germany or Europe. Contact between participants and partner organisations is established.

April to July, 2019: Three-month project internship in Germany within the global format and the fields of activity ASApreneurs and ASA university cooperation.

Between July, 2019, and January, 2020: Three-month project internship of the participants in the partner countries.

February and March, 2020: Review of the project phase, exchange about future engagement and networking. Realization of public events by the participants are possible.

Who are the ASA participants?

Young people between the ages of 21 and 30 who have completed their vocational training or are currently studying in Germany or the German-speaking Community of Belgium may apply. German citizens living abroad and applicants whose Bachelor degree is not older than 18 months are also eligible. In the global format, the participants from countries of the Global South are 21 to 35 years old and should be directly connected to the partner organisation.

ASA participants are no development experts, but socially committed, wishing to stand up for fair and sustainable development. They look forward to concrete tasks, own room for creative maneuver and the possibility of personal and critical consideration of global issues.

Fields of activity and programme formats

Fields of activity differ according to the partner organisations being active in different areas of sustainable global development. The programme formats vary in the constellation of the participants' teams.

ASA – Sustainable development and global partnership

Project internships in organisations of international cooperation and civil society deal with multiple strategies for a global sustainable development.

Format basic: After conclusion of both ASA seminars, the participants whose main place of residency is Germany spend their three-month project internship in a country in Africa, Asia, Latin America or South-Eastern Europe.

Format global: Participants from an African, Asian, Latin-American or South-Eastern European country and from Germany form a team. Their project phase has a duration of six months; three months in Germany followed by another three months in a country of the Global South.

GLEN - Global Learning and Education Network

Format basic: Within the framework of the Global Learning and Education Network (GLEN) tandems from 11 European and African countries form the participants' teams. Together they complete a three-month project internship.

ASA-Municipal – Learning and engagement in municipal development policy

Together with the Service Agency Communities in One World (SKEW) the ASA Programme offers a learning and engagement field within the context of municipal development policy.

Format basic: After a couple of days of visiting the German municipality, participants from Germany work three months in a partner municipality in a country of Africa, Asia, Latin America or South-Eastern Europe.

Format global: Before their three-month stay in the partner municipality in a country of the Global South, participants spend three months in the German partner municipality. Participants from Germany and a country in Africa, Asia, Latin America or South-Eastern Europe attend the entire six-month project internship phase, as well as the seminars, together as an international team.

ASApreneurs – Shaping a sustainable world

During project internships in cooperation with commercial companies and organisations of the wider business community, participants deal with the integration of social-ecological sustainability within economic processes.

Format basic: The project phase lasts six months, three months in Germany and three months at a partner organisation in Africa, Asia, Latin America or South-Eastern Europe.

ASA university cooperation – Innovative research and applied science for sustainability

Within the framework of a cooperation with institutions of tertiary education, participants co-shape international research projects dealing with social injustice, resource allocation and shortage as well as planetary boundaries.

Format basic: The project phase is six months, three months in Germany and three months at a partner organisation in a country of Africa, Asia, Latin America or South-Eastern Europe.

Format global: Participants from Germany and form a country in Africa, Asia, Latin America or South-Eastern Europe attend the entire six-month project internship phase together as an international team.

Why should you become a partner of the ASA Programme?

- As a partner organisation you profit from qualified and committed young persons who support your project and your organisation. While they bring in their experiences, impressions and ideas, they are eager to learn from you.
- You can set off important impulses for the participants' future involvement. After their project internship, they get involved in sustainable development and promote the understanding of global interdependencies.
- You profit from the global partner and alumni network of the ASA Programme.
- Offering a project in partnership with another organisation can contribute to an extension and consolidation of your international cooperation. The common project – from proposition to support of the participants – opens up the opportunity of establishing or further developing a project partnership.
- After the conclusion of the project internship you get, if required, a detailed report from the participants and an evaluation of results of the project.
