

Writing an Annotated Bibliography, APA Format

Overview

An annotated bibliography should list the full citations of each source you plan on referencing in your paper. These sources should be listed in alphabetical order. Directly under each citation should be one paragraph where you give a short synopsis of the source, your evaluation of the source, and how you plan to use it in your paper to strengthen your argument. That's all there is to it!
