The OWL at Purdue University, MLA 2009 Formatting and Style Guide:

- Path from Google: Type in "Purdue OWL." → Click the first link. → Once on the Purdue OWL homepage, click "MLA 2009 Formatting and Style Guide" (upper right-hand side). The Table of Contents is on the left side. Click on any of the options listed.

- The web site includes an **explanation of formatting MLA style (in-text citations and Works Cited page), model entries written for a student audience, a sample paper, a PowerPoint Presentation, and additional MLA resources.**
