

# Phrases

- An Adjective Phrase is a phrase that does the work of an Adjective.

Examples: He is a **wealthy** man.

He is a man **of wealth**.

The chief lived in a **stone** house.

The chief lived in a **house built of stone**.

He is an **honourable** man.

He is a man **of honour**.

# Phrases

- Adjective Phrase cannot be substituted by an Adjective in some cases as below

The wages **of Sin** is death.

The love **of praise** reigns in every heart.

He never felt the witchery **of the soft blue sky**.

# Phrases

- Adjective Phrase
- Examples ( Adjectives to Adjective Phrases):
  - The rose is a very **beautiful** flower.
  - The rose is a flower **of great beauty**.
  - A **courageous** man does not fear danger.
  - A **man of courage** does not fear danger.
  - Heroic** deeds deserve our admiration.
  - Deeds of heroism** deserve our admiration.

# Phrases

- Adjective Phrase

- Examples ( Adjective Phrases to Adjectives ) :

Some of the buildings in New York are **of great height**.

Some of the buildings in New York are very **high**.

Nelson was a boy **without fear**.

Nelson was a **fearless** boy.

Nobody likes a person **with a bad temper**.

Nobody likes an **ill-tempered** person.
