

100 Allusion Examples in Movies

- **Star Wars: A New Hope** - Obi-Wan Kenobi's line about Mos Eisley Spaceport as "a wretched hive of scum and villainy" subtly nods to Shakespeare's bleak view of life in "Macbeth."
- **The Matrix** - The character Neo is often seen as a Christ-like figure, his journey mimicking biblical tales of resurrection and messiah figures.
- **Shawshank Redemption** - When Andy escapes and leaves behind a Bible for the warden, the specific page is the book of Exodus, symbolizing Andy's escape as a modern-day exodus.
- **Pulp Fiction** - Jules recites Ezekiel 25:17 before executing people, an embellished Bible verse that serves to heighten the film's tension and drama.
- **Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone** - The Philosopher's Stone itself is an allusion to alchemical lore, where it is said to grant immortality and turn any metal into pure gold.
- **Inception** - The concept of a dream within a dream alludes to the philosophical problem of the "brain in a vat," questioning what's real and what's an illusion.
- **The Godfather** - The baptism scene juxtaposed with murders of the Five Families is an allusion to the duality of good and evil within one's nature.
- **Lord of the Rings: The Two Towers** - Gandalf's return as Gandalf the White parallels biblical resurrection stories, particularly that of Jesus Christ.

- **Fight Club** - The character Tyler Durden resembles the god Dionysus, representing chaos, wine, and revelry against the Apollo-like order represented by the narrator.
- **Black Swan** - The entire film is an allusion to the ballet Swan Lake, paralleling the story of Nina with that of the White and Black Swans from the ballet.
- **Pan's Labyrinth** - The film includes multiple allusions to classic fairy tales, including Alice in Wonderland, as a way to explore the dark realities of post-Civil War Spain.
- **The Lion King** - This film alludes to Shakespeare's "Hamlet," following a young prince who must navigate treachery within his own family.
