Now, East after four years of such conflict, the President is issuing a speach of recover liation, trying to convince his people to come back together with their Southern brethren, and try and head the grievously wounded notion. A gifted rhetoricion, the Plesident used three primary likelory tools to make his point: parallel structure to illestrate similarities between Northerner and Southerner, allucions to the Bible to highlight the Christian volves so important to both, and person ficution to paint the wor as on evil enemy, and the notion as a wounded offy Friend. In the second paragraph, Lincoln concludes with the parallel statements one ... would make war rather than let the nation survive ... the other would accept war rather than let it parish, and the war come." While this obviously paints the south as the appressors, it is for from a condemnation instead it has the North shoring responsibily for the conflict, through their willingness to "occept wor." Later, in the third paragraph, the President states "neither party expected for the vor the magnitude or the duration which it has already attained, wither anticipated that the cause of the conflict might cause [before it] ... each looked for an easier triumph ... both read the Bible and prayed to the same God, and coch invoked his oid." Again he re-inforces the similarities be tween the two sides, in their expectations and wishes for the War, and in their Christian values. The Christian volves shead by both sides is fir they emphasized by Lincoln through allusions. He says in the third paragraph "let is judge not, fest that we be not judged." This is a direct allusion to Jesust and his statement judge not lest yelve judged." It reflects Christian values of forgiveness, something North and South share, and that should cartainly apply for both in their current stration Lincoln also quetes the Bible twice in the third paragraph, in the sections "war ... comethind" the judgments ... rightors alterether." Both these allecions point how the values shored by North and South apply to the wright situation. With frequent use of He and Him, Lincoln shows how the wor way full into God's plan; this encourages both sides to not lose faith, and to bear in mind God's teachings shall still be followed. Finally, Lincoln tries to personify both the war and the notion, the


