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
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Mech. 3.

A uniform rod of mass M and length L is attached to a pivot of negligible friction as shown above. The pivot is located at a distance $\frac{L}{3}$ from the left end of the rod. Express all answers in terms of the given quantities and fundamental constants.

(a) Calculate the rotational inertia of the rod about the pivot.

$$\lambda = \frac{M}{L} \qquad dM = \lambda dX = \frac{1}{L} \cdot dX$$

$$I = \sum M Y^2 = \int_0^{\frac{2}{3}L} \frac{M}{L} dX \cdot X^2 + \int_0^{\frac{1}{3}} \frac{M}{L} dX \cdot X^2$$

$$= \frac{M}{L} \left(\frac{X^3}{3} \right)_0^{\frac{2}{3}L} + \frac{M}{L} \left(\frac{X^3}{3} \right)_0^{\frac{2}{3}L}$$

$$= \frac{M}{L} \left(\frac{\frac{27}{3}L}{3} + \frac{\frac{27}{3}L}{3} \right)$$

$$= \frac{ML^2}{L}$$

= 712 (b) The rod is then released from rest from the horizontal position shown above. Calculate the linear speed of

the bottom end of the rod when the rod passes through the vertical.

$$h = \frac{1}{3}L \qquad h_1 = \frac{1}{2}L \qquad W = \frac{3}{3}L \Rightarrow V = \frac{3}{3}L \cdot W$$

$$Ui + Ki = Uf + Kf$$

$$Mgh + 0 = Mgh_1 + \frac{1}{2}Iw^2$$

$$Mg \cdot \frac{2L}{3} = Mg \cdot \frac{L}{3} + \frac{1}{2} \cdot \frac{ML}{9} \cdot w^2$$


$$4MgL = 3MgL + \frac{ML^2}{3}w^2$$

$$\Rightarrow \frac{ML^2w^2}{3} = MgL \Rightarrow w^2 = \frac{3MgL}{ML^2} \Rightarrow w = \sqrt{\frac{39}{L}}$$

$$\Rightarrow V = \frac{2L}{3} \cdot \sqrt{\frac{39}{L}} = \sqrt{\frac{4L^2}{93}} \cdot \frac{39}{L} = \sqrt{\frac{4L9}{3}}$$

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


(c) The rod is brought to rest in the vertical position shown above and hangs freely. It is then displaced slightly from this position. Calculate the period of oscillation as it swings.

$$W = \sqrt{\frac{Mgd}{I}} \Rightarrow T = \frac{2\pi}{W} = 2\pi \sqrt{\frac{I}{Mgd}}$$

$$\Rightarrow T = 2\pi \sqrt{\frac{ML^2}{9}} = 2\pi \sqrt{\frac{NL^4}{93} \cdot \frac{k^2}{MgA}} = 2\pi \sqrt{\frac{2L}{39}}$$

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


Mech. 3.


