

# 100 Double Entendre language Examples

- "Do you have a map? Because I just got lost in your eyes." Uses "lost" metaphorically to express being captivated by someone's eyes.
- "Are you a magician? Whenever I look at you, everyone else disappears." Implies that the person is so enchanting that others fade from attention.
- "Is your name Wi-Fi? Because I'm feeling a connection." Plays on the idea of a wireless connection to signify mutual attraction.

- "Are you a time traveler? Because I can see you in my future." Implies a lasting interest by referencing the future.
- "Excuse me, but I think you dropped something: my jaw." "Dropped my jaw" indicates surprise or being impressed.
