

# Officiant Wedding Speech

---

## 1. Opening and Welcome

- Greet the guests warmly and thank them for being part of the celebration.
- Introduce the purpose of the day.

### Example:

"Dear friends and family, welcome! Today, we are gathered here to celebrate one of life's greatest moments—the joining of [Partner 1's Name] and [Partner 2's Name] in marriage. Thank you all for being here to witness and support this union."

## 2. Opening Remarks

- Reflect on the meaning of love and marriage.

## 7. Closing Remarks

- Conclude the ceremony with a blessing, wish, or final reflection.

### Example:

## 8. Presentation of the Couple

- Officially introduce the couple to the guests for the first time.

### Example:

"Friends and family, it is my greatest honor to present to you for the very first time, [Mr. and Mrs. Last Name / the married couple / Partner 1 and Partner 2]!"
